#### **ABOUT THE HOST**

The Nanaji Deshmukh Veterinary Science University (NDVSU), established on November 3, 2009, is a leading institution for veterinary science in India. It comprises three veterinary colleges located in Jabalpur, Mhow, and Rewa, along with the

College of Fisheries Science, the Animal Biotechnology Center, and five Veterinary Polytechnic institutions offering degree and diploma programs.

The School of Wildlife Forensic and Health (SWFH) operates as a specialised unit under NDVSU. Initially established in 2001 as the Department of Wildlife Health and Management under Jawaharlal Nehru Krishi Vishwa Vidyalaya, it was upgraded to the Centre for Wildlife Forensic and Health in 2009 and renamed SWFH in 2016. SWFH offers Masters and doctoral programs in Wildlife Health Management and provides technical support to state wildlife agencies in Central India for wildlife health monitoring, disease diagnosis, and forensic investigations.

#### **VENUE AND LOCATION**

Jabalpur, located along the Narmada River, is known as "Sanskardhani" (Cultural Capital), and is renowned for its historical and natural attractions including the, unique marble rock formations, Dhuandhar Falls and Madan Mahal Fort. Nearby prominent national parks: Pench (160 km), Kanha (167 km), and Bandhavgarh (170 km). Other nearby destinations include Pachmarhi (200 km) and Khajuraho (250

#### CALL FOR ABSTRACTS AND GUIDELINES FOR SUBMISSION

Researchers are invited to submit abstracts of original research or clinical work for presentation. Abstracts must include the title (in uppercase), authors (highlighting the presenting author), and affiliation. Contact details of the corresponding author, including email ID, mobile number, and full address, should also be provided. The body should be limited to 250 words, typed in Times New Roman, 12-point font, and double-spaced.

#### **Submission Process:**

Submit abstracts (for both oral and poster presentations) along with the registration form and fees to ICWH2025@gmail.com by 15th March 2025. Preference for oral/poster presentation may be given while submitting abstracts. The final mode of presentation (oral or poster) will finally be determined by the technical committee and communicated in the acceptance letter. Presenters are required to confirm their participation upon acceptance.

#### Presentation Guidelines:

Oral Presentations: Should be prepared in PowerPoint format. Invited lectures are allotted 10 minutes, and Oral presentations are allotted 5 minutes, followed by a 2-minute discussion. Each presenter may submit up to two abstracts.

Poster Presentations: Must be self-explanatory [Size 33 inches (84 cm) wide by 46 inches (117 cm) tall (A0 size, portrait mode)]. It is advisable to avoid synthetic material for poster printing.
